Two days before Christmas 2024 marks the oneyear anniversary of the addition of our United Methodist Church's official emblem to the Edgemont campus signage. The plan to add the Cross and Flame took shape in 2007 in the Genesis Adult Sunday School class. Approximately 65 church and community members constructed and raised the emblem which was adopted at the birth of The United Methodist Church in 1968 with the merger of the Methodist Church with the Evangelical United Brethren Church. Here are some of the lyrics: "There's a new world coming, and it's just around the bend. There's a new world coming; one's coming to an end. There's a new voice calling; you can hear it if you try." And then the song ends with "coming in peace, coming in joy, coming in love."

It was the yearning of a generation; for the Vietnam war to end; for racial violence and injustice to cease. Sadly, as one of the YouTube commenters said, while praising Cass Elliot's voice, "We've been waiting for this new day for more than 50 years."

It's hard to wait, but the gospel keeps us oriented. As we prepare to remember our Lord's birth and his coming again, we yearn with expectant hope. The prophet Isaiah prayed, "O that you would rend the heavens and come down" (64:1). That is exactly what God did. In Christ Jesus, he came to dwell among us. And he has promised the new day. It will come. In the meantime, we wait. We yearn, expectantly, in Christian confidence.

May your Christmas preparations proceed with Christ's love surrounding you.
