I recently read a book that included the intriguing phrase, "cruel optimism." It describes something we know in lots of different areas of life. For example, you want to lose weight. You try one diet. It doesn't work, so you try another diet. It works for a little while and then doesn't. So, you try yet another diet and it, too, disappoints, but you keep looking. You keep trying.

Maybe diet is not your issue. Maybe it's New Years resolutions. Each year you make them. Each year, after a few tries, you give up in boredom or discouragement. Whatever habit you may be trying to quit, or whatever new habit you may be trying to develop, we are all very aware of the fact that, lots and lots of times, the effort doesn't produce what we envision it to produce.

But we keep trying. The cruel optimism is thinking that "this time," the diet, the New Years resolution, the new technique, will work. This time. The optimism lies in the assumption that we are able to do whatever it was we tried and failed to do. The cruelty is that our optimism so often disappoints.

The opening line of the old hymn, "Fill My Cup, Lord," gets at the same point: "Like the woman at the well, I was seeking for things that could not satisfy."




Seeking Sisters is hosting the Third Sunday
