One evening, we were sitting together in the moonlight, talking (yes, just talking). I'm not the most demonstrative guy when it comes to affection. I'm pretty reserved, actually, but I really liked Bekki, so I worked up the nerve to say, in a playful voice, "You know, I kinda' like you." All of a sudden, things got serious. She looked at me with big doe eyes and said, "You know, I don't think I *just* like you." Now, pay attention to the word order. What I heard her say was, "You know, I just don't think I like you." I was, to say the least, stunned. I had just made a sincere if lame play and she appeared to be shutting me down, which was very confusing. So, I said, "Well, maybe we shouldn't be here." Bekki and I were part of the leadership group. Our younger peers watched me anxiously to see how I would handle things. The old flame had joined the singing group too, so things got awkward fast.

I learned something of God's love in that painful (for the moment) teenage experience. I learned of God's faithfulness, of the love of Christian brothers and sisters, of the Body of Christ. It was a great lesson. The Challengers were like family. I could have reacted to the injustice of being dumped in ways that harmed the group. I didn't, not because I was such a puttogether guy. I really wasn't. God gave me a desire, plain and simple, to forgive, to make peace.

Valentine's Day is the Feast of Saint Valentine, a saint who ministered to persecuted Christians during Roman Empire days. Through him, God's love and faithfulness was made plain. You don't need a cheesy card from anyone to be reminded that God loves you. Through thick and thin, ups and downs, good times and bad, the best of all, God is with us. He is the God of steadfast love. May we never forget.
