My January 2024 pastor's newsletter column was titled, "Year of Discernment and Decision." Why did I use these terms? In one sense, discernment and decisions are part of the normal life of the church. We are an organization, and every organization has business to do. We worship, study, and serve. We make decisions about when, where, and how. We also have to pay the bills and keep the lights on (and the water and sewer working).

But beyond the basic functions of a church that need constant attention from its leaders, we are in an unusual position. Two congregations became one legally, at the beginning of 2022. Becoming one congregation spiritually, developing an identity as one congregation that we share, takes time and attention. We did some good work in 2024. More good work to come.

We've done quite a bit of discussing about our two facilities, which we now call the Edgemont campus and the St. Paul (Washington St.) campus. We are grateful to have both, especially in times like now when water and sewer challenges at the Edgemont campus made moving all worship and group activities to St. Paul necessary. These situations indicate some of the ongoing discerning and deciding that we need to do. How do we utilize our facilities the best way to do what God is calling us to do in this new season of church life? Some questions are difficult but necessary to entertain.

Questions about our facilities drive us to more basic questions. Who are we as a United Methodist congregation participating in the Kingdom of God? Whom is God calling us to reach in 2025? How do we love our neighbors in Arkansas City? How do we care for the needy? How do we share Christ's love with them? How do we invite them into a rich and growing fellowship with God? These questions are real ones that need careful, prayerful consideration. 2025 is the year to accept this challenge. (See PASTOR, p.3)

You can find the weekly Bible readings by downloading the YouVersion Bible app on your phone or by scanning the QR Code at left with your phone camera. Once you've downloaded the app, go to Plans and search for "Bible in a Year: 364-Day Reading Plan."

The image is below so you can find the plan everyone is using.

Each day, after you've read the daily passages, tap each circle next to the passage to indicate you've read it. That way, the new day's reading will appear when you open the app the following day.

If this is all too complicated for you, but you want to use the phone app, come visit Joni in the church office during regular office hours or following worship on any given Sunday. She'll help you get your phone set up.

And if *that* **is too complicated**, pick up the daily readings in the weekly bulletin insert. OR email the church office (we need your email address) and we'll email you a copy of the weekly reading every week.

- Water/sewer issues at Edgemont campus considered
- Memorial wall policy and plaque updates in the works
- Approved a congregation-based Christian Ashram

FINANCE TRUSTEES

- Receiving bids to fix the Edgemont campus water and sewer issues.
- Receiving bids to fix the drain on furnaces at St. Paul campus.
- Planning a door-lock inventory at the Edgemont building.
- Considered insurance quotes and renewed the church's policy with Brotherhood Mutual.
- Delayed floor waxing until the water issues are resolved.
- Approved closing the Building Fund checking account to track trustee income and expenses within the General Fund checking account.

Building Fund Clarification

The church has two bank accounts related to buildings and facilities: the Forward in Faith account, which holds funds for future building capital improvements, and the Building Fund, which is for ongoing building and facility upkeep. When members pledge to the Building Fund, they pledge support for ongoing facility (not operational) maintenance of all the church's properties.

At the December committee meeting, the trustees voted to close the checking account for the Building Fund and continue tracking income and expenses for the trustees within the General Fund checking account. If you pledge to the Building Fund, those pledges will be applied to the line item designated to the trustees for regular facility maintenance. In this light, call the church office if you would like to make any adjustments to your 2025 giving pledge.
